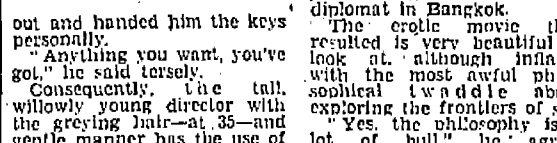
Money
